	<u><i>Adiantum hispidulum</i></u> <u>Rosy Maidenhair</u>	Dark green, stiff, five fingered older fronds, named for its rosy pink new fronds.
	<u><i>Adiantum peruvianum</i></u> <u>Silver Doller Fern</u>	Delicate fern valued for its silvery pink new fronds. Fronds can reach 36”.
	<u><i>Adiantum raddianum 'Fritz Luthii'</i></u> <u>Fritz Luthii Maidenhair Fern</u>	Delicate fern has small, compact, soft green, triangular shaped foliage. Keep soil moist, not soggy, at all times.
	<u><i>Adiantum raddianum 'Fragrans'</i></u> <u>Fragrans Maidenhair Fern</u>	Delicate fern has soft green, triangular shaped foliage. Low light. Keep soil moist, not soggy, at all times. 70-75F.
	<u><i>Adiantum raddianum 'Pacific Maid'</i></u> <u>Pacific Maid Maidenhair Fern</u>	Delicate fern has soft green foliage. Low light. Keep soil moist, not soggy, at all times. 70-75F.
	<u><i>Arachniodes simplicor 'variegata'</i></u> <u>East Indian Holly Fern</u>	East Indian Holly Fern. Slow growing with glossy green fronds that have a very prominent yellow variegation. Nice accent plant.
	<u><i>Asplenium nidus</i></u> <u>Bird's Nest Fern</u>	Wide green fronds forming a crown that resembles a bird’s nest. Indirect light, very moist soil but not soggy. 65-70F.
	<u><i>Asplenium antiquum 'Victoria'</i></u> <u>Victoria Bird's Nest Fern</u>	Wavy margins set this easy to grow Bird’s Nest fern apart from the others. Keep soil moist, not soggy, at all times.
	<u><i>Blechnum 'Silver Lady'</i></u> <u>Silver Lady Fern</u>	A small tree fern. Bright green foliage grows from a central trunk. Do not allow to dry out. Shade only. 70-75F
	<u><i>Cheilanthesargentea</i></u> <u>Silver Cloak Fern</u>	Small triangular fronds with green above and white below.
	<u><i>Cibotium glaucum 'Dicksonianaceae'</i></u> <u>Hapu'u pulu Tree Fern</u>	This common species has golden pulu (hairs) on the trunk . Full sun or partial shade. Well drained soil with lots of water. 60-75F.
	<u><i>Cibotium menziesii 'Dicksonianaceae'</i></u> <u>Hapu'u ii Tree Fern</u>	Large bright green fronds up to 9’ long. Full sun or partial shade. Well drained soil with lots of water. 60-75F.

	<i>Crytomium falcatum 'Rochfordii'</i> Japanese Holly Fern	Holly like fronds are glossy and leathery. Durable and easy to grow. Low light. Moderately moist soil. 65-70F.
	<i>Davallia trichomanoides</i> Squirrel's Foot Fern	Lacy dark green fronds, 8 to 14" long. Furry rhizomes wander at will. Low to high light. Well drained potting mix. Moist-dry. 60-75F.
	<i>Dicsonia Antarctica</i> Tasmanian Tree Fern	A large slow growing tree fern for less sunny more protected areas. Can handle more cold areas.
	<i>Didymochlaena trunkatula</i> Mahogany Fern	Upright growth, glossy foliage up to 3' long. Young fronds are mahogany turning to a deep green. Indirect light, moist soil. 55-75F.
	<i>Diplazium esculentum</i> Edible Fern	The young fronds and fiddleheads of this fern are eaten in many countries of the Pacific region.
	IMAGE NOT AVAILABLE <i>Hemionitis arifolia</i> Heart Fern	Dark green heart shaped fronds. Fertile fronds have extra long stems. Medium to low light. Keep soil moist but not soggy at all times. 70-75F.
	<i>Microlepia strigosa</i> Lace Fern, Palapalai Fern	A pretty naturalized fern used extensively in Hula to adorn altars and to make ornaments. Low to medium light. Moist to semi dry. 55-75F.
	<i>Microsorium punctatum</i> Green Flame Fern	Fronds are thick and green with the end of the frond spreading out and divided to look like flames.
	<i>Microsorium scolopendria</i> Lau'e Fern, Maile Scented Fern	Broad, flat, oblong, shiny, dark green fronds up to 3' long. Creeping rhizomes. Full sun to shade. Can dry out for short periods. Moist to semi-dry soil. 55-75F.
	<i>Nephrolepis bisserata</i> Macho Fern	Sword fern with large dark green fronds up to 4' long. Medium to low light. Moderately moist soil. 60-75F
	<i>Nephrolepis cordifolia 'Duffii'</i> Lemon Button Fern	Interesting sword fern with thin upright fronds and small round leaflets. Low to medium light. Moist soil. 55-70F.
	<i>Nephrolepis cordifolia 'Tim's Petticoat'</i> Petticoat Fern	Many forks and re forks on the tips of the fronds give this fern the appearance of petticoats. Nice hanging fern.
	<i>Nephrolepis cordifolia 'Nephrolepidaceae'</i> Kupukupu Fern	Tough attractive dark green fronds up to 2' tall. Sun tolerant, drought tolerant, moist to semi-moist soil. 60-75F.
	<i>Nephrolepis exaltata 'bisserata'</i> Fish Tail Fern	Large arching green leathery fronds, sickle shaped leaflets. Medium light. Moderately moist soil. 55-70F.

	<i>Nephrolepis exaltata 'Boston Euro'</i> True Boston Fern	Evergreen favorite. Well rounded habit, long drooping fronds, most common Boston fern used for hanging baskets. Medium light. Moderately moist soil. 55-70F.
	<i>Pellaea rotundifolia</i> Button Fern	Bright light. Acidic humus rich soil. Well drained soil or potting mix. Moist-dry. 60-75F.
	<i>Platycerium bifurcatum</i> Staghorn Fern	Also known as “Elkhorn Fern”. Coarse well drained potting mix, or mounted on tree-fern fiber or weathered hardwood .
	<i>Platycerium veitchii 'Lemoinei'</i> French Staghorn Fern	Does well in hot areas, does not require wet conditions.
	<i>Polypodium attenuatum</i> Falax Fern	An unusual fern with highly divided green fronds.
	<i>Polystichum polyblepharum</i> Tassel Fern	Evergreen fern has deep green, glossy leaves with silver underside up to 3’ long. Partial shade or shade.70-75F
	<i>Polystichum tsus-simense</i> Kolean Rock Fern	Evergreen fern has deep green triangular fronds up to 12” long. Moist soil. Partial shade or shade. 60-75F
	<i>Pteris cretica 'Albo lineata'</i> Table Fern, Dish Fern	Wide green fronds with white stripe down the center. Low light. Moderately moist soil. 55-80F
	<i>Pteris 'evergemiensis'</i> Silver Lace Fern	Long fronds are silver outlined in green. Prefers low light. Moist soil. 65-75F.
	<i>Rumohra adiantiformis</i> Leatherleaf Fern	Deeply cut, glossy, dark green triangular fronds often used in flower arrangements. Low to medium light. Moist soil. 70-75F.
	<i>Salvinia auriculata</i> Floating Fern	Small floating plants used in ponds and aquariums. Fronds are roundish, flat, ½” long. Medium light. Aquatic. Warm temperatures.
	<i>Selaginella uncinata</i> Peacock Spike Moss	Not moss but a very low growing spreading fern relative. Good ground cover in shady and wet areas.
	<i>Selaginella emmeliana</i> Sweat Plant, Moss Fern	Creeping rhizomes with fluffy green foliage. Makes a good ground cover in dark we places.
	<i>Selaginella erythropus 'Sanguinea'</i> Ruby Red Spike Moss	Low creeping mat with attractive ruby red underneath of leaves. low light and like wet areas.
